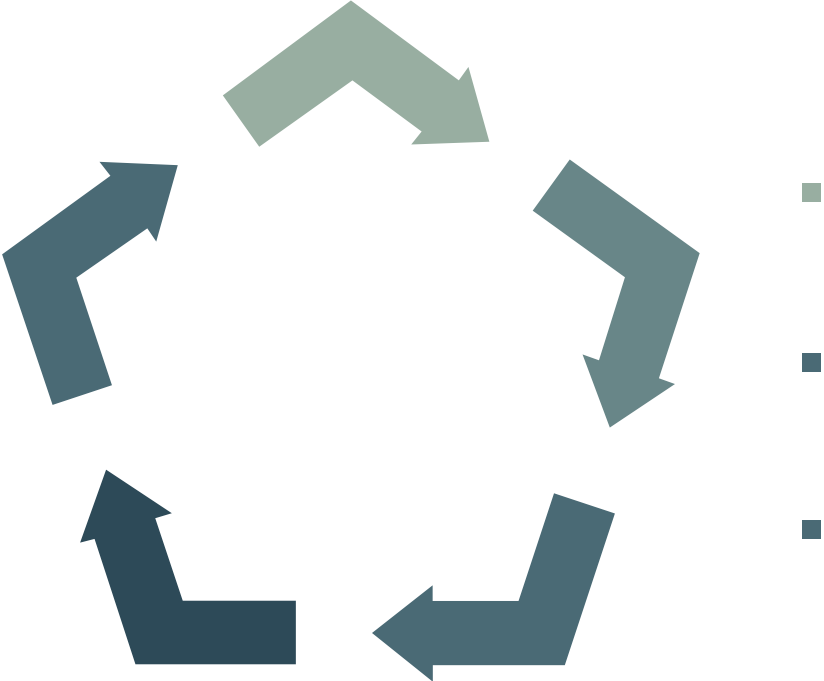

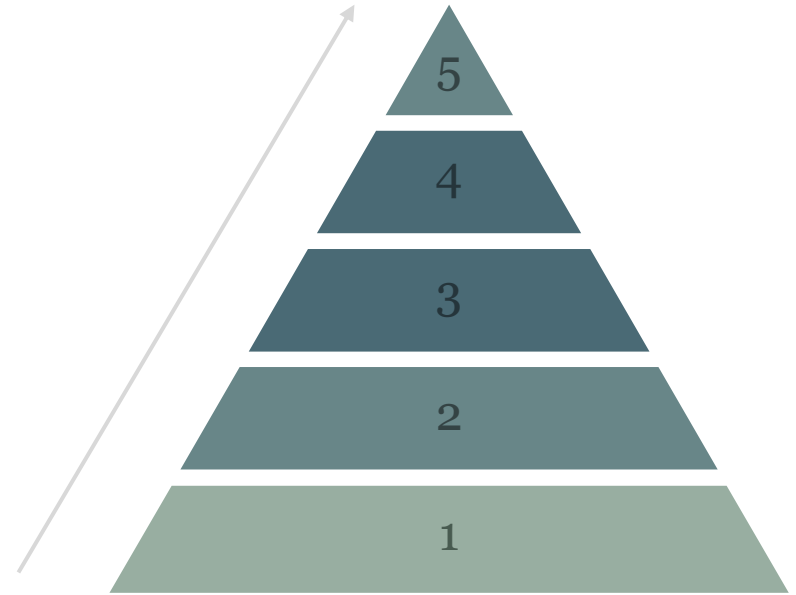
What is the central message that comes from Richard's story?

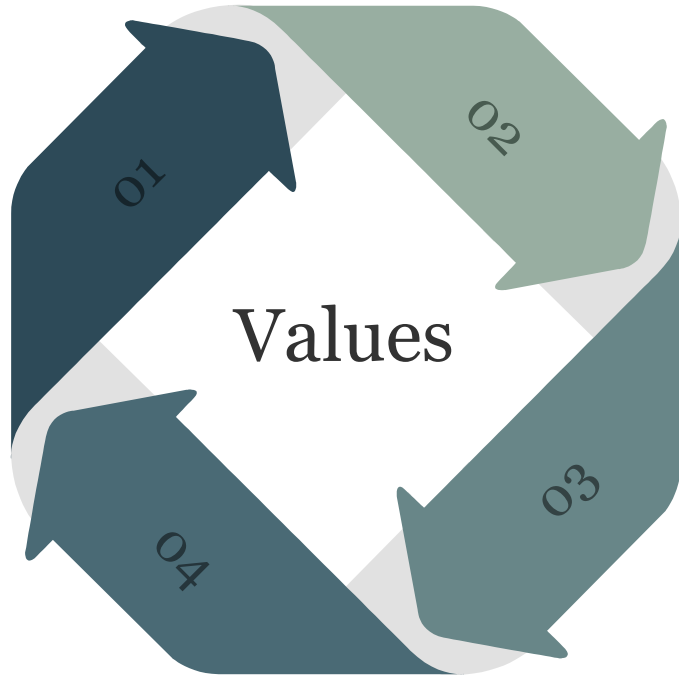
In the oral tradition, Richard relays stories of his childhood and some of the ways in which his family managed to survive on the land.
